### SAVE THOSE STAMPS::

The Alliance Stamp Ministries of Florida is asking for help collecting cancelled postage stamps. They resell the stamps that are attached

to envelopes – **cut 1/4 - 1/3" around the stamp**. With the proceeds, they write and print interdenominational Sunday School materials to be distributed in 13 Latin American countries. After volunteers sort and package the stamps, they are sold to wholesalers. In 2012, the ministry earned \$25,000 and in 2013, they earned \$37,000. They are hoping to double that amount this year!



### PRAYING FOR THE NEW YEAR

Go to now, ye that say, today or

tomorrow we will go into such a city, and continue there a year, and buy and sell, and get gain: Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapour, that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away. For that ye ought to say, If the Lord will, we shall live, and do this, or that. (James 4:13-15)

With excitement we should begin the journey through this new year with a real faith in God. Life during this year will be a task. It should be a mission. It may be a contest. It probably will involve battle.

Here James is warning against taking life for granted or thinking that you are in control of all that will happen in the coming year. Rather we need to be praying for God's will to be accomplished in and through our lives.

Our purpose on this earth is to bring glory to God through our worship, service and life. The only way to fully accomplish this is by the Holy Spirit's work of producing love and fruitful service through us. So as the hymn writer wrote "More love to thee O Christ, More love to Thee! Hear Thou the prayer I make on bended knee"

#### II. Let Us Pray For Proper Guidance

As we face the journey of the new year we should recognize that there are some dangers involved in every journey. It so easy to live life by habit rather than by the guiding hand of the Lord. Did you think to ask for the Lord's guidance this morning or only go about your day as you always have. If we are to walk through this year confidently and in a manner that glorifies God, we need divine guidance. So let us sing in our hearts "Savior like a shepherd lead us, Much we need thy tender care; In thy pleasant pasture feed us, for our use Thy fold prepare."

### FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART (Part One)

The end of one year and the beginning of another – those are times for looking back as well

as looking forward. So I thought I would reflect on some of the things that I enjoyed working on last year in the life of the church before I take a look at some things I'm looking forward to in 2016.

In January of 2015 (it's hard to believe 2015 is almost over!) I began a sermon series on the Old Testament book of Joshua. I took a break for Lent, Easter, Mother's Day and Father's Day (as well as vacations) but other than those dates, the series took us all the way into the summer months.

In February we invited former pro wrestler Ted (The Million Dollar Man) Dibiase to be here for the Men's Conference we hosted. It was an exceptional experience for all who attended. Several pastors in the community (myself included) led workshops for the men.

February was also the beginning of Lent and we hosted several Lenten discussion groups using the Chip Ingram curriculum on Romans chapter 12.

March brought Dave and Joyce Reed to us for a Sunday night dinner and presentation. Dave and Joyce are our special interest missionaries. They serve in Mexico on the Baja Peninsula but they were home last year on sabbatical. They are launching a new phase of their ministry this year that will take them to South America and the Caribbean Islands on assignment. You can check out information about them on the Missions bulletin board in the foyer.

The highlight of April was obviously was Easter and the annual Easter Dinner. We served a record number of people and did it for the first time without Judy Wightman's leadership. It was an adventure, but we did it! Now to find a director for *this year's* event!

May was begun (as usual) with the annual spring clean-up event, followed closely by our Mother's Day observation. We needed to schedule another clean-up day in June after the hard winter however. At the end of June I was able to attend the Biennial meetings of the American Baptist Churches/USA in Kansas City. There, I participated in discussions about leadership development and future planning and farewell events for our General Secretary and Home Mission Society Director. While I was gone to KC, we hosted another very successful Vacation Bible Camp here with over 70 kids attending! July was an especially momentous month at First Baptist! First, after approximately 70 years on AM radio, we moved our broadcast to an FM station (EAGLE 99.1). It hasn't always been a smooth transition due to technical issues at the station but things seem to be getting straightened out as time goes on. The change has helped to boost the size of our broadcast area and provides a "cleaner" sound, especially for our music ministry.

The other milestone event in July was the Gold City Southern Gospel concert on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend. The atmosphere was electric for this! We are hoping to bring them back this coming Independence Day weekend. A few weeks after this, Dave DeGroff came home to us and led a sermon in song and mini concert followed by a chicken barbecue. Meanwhile Pastor Bruce again led a midweek summertime outreach to the folks living in the projects at Alder Court. That outreach culminated in late August with a backpack giveaway to the children and teens there.

I spent several weeks in July focusing our attention during worship on the Christian heritage that is such an integral part of the American legacy. In addition to sermons, we had a discussion group on these topics during the Sunday School hour.

In August we held another successful rummage sale, enjoyed a church picnic and intergenerational Sunday School class at War Vet's Park (as well as taking advantage of the swimming pool there) and our ladies traveled to Philadelphia for the final year of Women of Faith gatherings.

In recent months of course we launched the stewardship theme under the "Thrive" theme, hosted another gospel music concert with the Jonathans, celebrated Pastor Appreciation month, sent the teens to another American Baptist Youth Convention, hosted another free Veteran's Day Breakfast, enjoyed the Giving Thanks Dinner, took offerings to benefit the chaplaincy Program at OGH and World Missions, hung the greens for Christmas, hosted a Ladies Christmas Retreat with Proverbs 31 Ministries speaker Wendy Pope, went caroling, hosted a candlelight service for families who have lost children, enjoyed another Christmas Cantata and the candlelight Christmas Eve service.

Nobody can say we haven't had a full year! Interspersed throughout those events were ministries like home visits and home communion, weddings, memorial services, baby dedications, baptisms and the welcoming of several new members. All in all, 2015 was a very good year at First Baptist Church of Olean! *~Pastor Dan* 



### FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART (Part Two)

As I look ahead to 2016 I am already anticipating several

ministry opportunities. I would like to explain a little about what has moved me to suggest them.

For most of the time I have been here, people who have belonged to this church for decades have reminisced about the concerts we used to host here. For a few years we hosted Jazz Vespers, offering local talent on a monthly basis on Friday nights until the leadership for that ministry stepped aside. Then recently our Diaconate began contemplating the launch of an "Event Ministry". We have considered a variety of Christian artists (musicians, painters, comedians, etc.)

We decided that the first event we wanted to sponsor was a Southern Gospel group – and we wanted it to be someone with tremendous name recognition. We were shocked to find that Gold City was going to be in the area and available on a freewill offering basis. This seemed like an answer to prayer! Although we had very little time to promote the concert, we felt it was an opportunity we could not pass up. One of the top 10 gospel groups in the country right here in our sanctuary!

Frankly the turnout was not what we hoped for but the atmosphere in our sanctuary was electric! Even Gold City commented on the strong presence of the Holy Spirit there. And they expressed an eager desire to return to us next year!

Since then we have hosted The Jonathans and Wendy Pope from Proverbs 31 Ministries. We were tremendously blessed by both of these experiences yet we remain somewhat disappointed by the attendance. What can we do to improve and take these events to the next level?

One thing that we have done is we formed a committee to help with the promotion and advertising of the events. It is our plan to get ahead of things as early as possible and to seek as many venues as possible to get the word out (newspaper, radio, television, posters and social media). Ultimately we know that the success or failure of these events will rest on the shoulders of the members of this church to spread "word of mouth" that will generate sincere enthusiasm for them.

Recently we discussed the possibility of expanding the event ministry to a monthly format

similar to Jazz Vespers. Unfortunately we just did not find the support for it yet. Those who have been working on these events are filling many different roles in our church, and this was just "one thing too many" (at least at this point). But we plan to revisit the idea in the future.

Meanwhile Cari Matejka, Dana Boser, Jodie Martin, Josh Anderson and myself have been meeting to plan a trip to Uguanda (Africa) this coming summer. As you know Cari has made several trips with Embrace It Africa (EIA) to the Bethlehem Parents School (BPS) and Orphanage there. Many of us have followed her travels there with rapt interest and of course we have invited her to speak about her experiences there on several occasions.

This past summer it became clear to me that if our congregation is going to continue to be invested in the work that Cari and Embrace It Africa have begun there, we need to get a better first-hand idea of what we can do. Cari has some ambitious visions about what can be accomplished – visions that our congregation alone is unlikely to fulfill. But we need to start somewhere.

So on June 27 of 2016 the team I listed above (and anyone else who might be feeling led to join us) will depart for Africa. I will be there for 10 days. Cari and the others may stay longer. Meanwhile I have spoken to the Board of Mission about taking our support for this ministry "up a notch". We are going to consider sponsoring a teacher or 2 at BPS and will continue to encourage people in our congregation and elsewhere to sponsor students.

There seem to be some issues on the EIA website that Cari and I are trying to clear up in order to make these sponsorships possible, but I can assure you that you will be hearing more about this in the months to come. Stay tuned.

I have also been planning for some time now to accompany my daughter Sarah and her husband Alfonse to Pakistan (Alfonse's native land). His family has been very active in the Christian ministry in Lahore – the largest city in Pakistan. Recently they launched an exciting new ministry called the CosmoVision Center (a primary school, orphanage and trade school for Christians in Lahore). Going there will also allow me to meet Alfonse's family for the first time.

I originally planned to go in November but doors closed preventing us from going. So we rescheduled for February or 2016. Those doors appear to be closing now too. November seems the most likely alternative. I will keep you informed! **Pastor Dan** 

### NEW MEMBER SAYS OFBC DISCUSSES AND FOLLOWS BIBLE

Sharon Anthony, one of our newest members at Olean First Baptist, was born in St. Thomas in the U.S. Virgin Islands, the youngest of 12 children.

"Picture the Olean town limits and that's as far as you could go," she said, with the borders being beaches, the weather tropical.

At 16, Sharon's father sent her to New York City to care for her sick mother. While attending high school in Manhattan, Sharon later had to walk blocks to the hospital to see her mother, who had cancer. On her deathbed, her mom made her father promise he'd see that Sharon could go to college. He'd made plans for her to attend Villa Nova. But Sharon was so impacted by her mother's death, she needed time to think about her future. She realized her father had her whole life planned out for her.

"In the islands, it's a cultural thing," she said. "Parents even pick out who you're supposed to marry." The thought felt too confining. Although she'd always believed, she also admits she was kind of mad at God at the time.

"One day, I just got on a plane and joined the navy," she said. Sharon served in Maine in an aviation squadron for five years, and was later stationed on a base in Connecticut. Then it was time to go out to sea. A brand new ship had been precommissioned and when it sailed, she was on it.

"That was in the early stages where women were finally allowed on combatant ships," she said. She saw combat in the First Gulf War around the time the USS Cole was bombed in a terrorist attack in Yemen while refueling, and also after 9/11.

"There were 100 ships in the Gulf so you could see mortars coming in," she said. "I was on the bridge, qualified for weapons. I watched a missile come up from the silo and go off the ship. Each one of those cost a quarter of a million dollars and we shot off 25." That was on the US Oscar Austin.

Her second ship was the James E. Williams that served off the Horn of Africa as a supply ship.

"There was human trafficking going on as people came up out of Somalia," she said.

Sharon served on two other ships out of Virginia, and her final tour was headquartered in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. She'd been tagged as part of a team to supply and detail a specific class of destroyers and train those who would be on it. In 2010, she retired after 24 years in the navy. Sharon had visited friends in the Olean area.

"I looked around and said, 'This is pretty nice," she recalls. She owns 100 acres in the Bolivar area and purchased a home in Richburg. Sharon said she had attended an Episcopal church all her life, but this past year felt God was leading her on a different path. She'd experienced prompting earlier with questions she'd had about her faith.

"I had a friend in the navy who always read his Bible," she said. Over time, he encouraged her to dig deeper into the Word.

"I also started watching a lot of Christian TV and listened to preachers like Joyce Meyer," she said. Soon she started to gain a sense of peace she hadn't had before. When she came to Olean First Baptist late last summer, she began to notice a new joy bubbling forth.

"The way I believe has not changed," she said. "But the concept of getting into the Bible studies and the Word was different. You have a Bible in every pew here and you live and walk out your faith."
