EYEGLASSES FOR HAITI

One of the most appreciated services at the Cap Haitien Eye Center is the provision of eyeglasses at a very nominal cost. For every person needing surgery, there are literally hundreds more who need eyeglasses. Patients include children and young people in school, as well as their mothers and fathers who have to hold reading material at arm's length or have difficulty threading a needle. Almost all of the seniors need some reading assistance or visual aid.

All of the eyeglasses are used, recycled eyeglasses provided by friends, churches, women's groups and organizations. Any eyeglasses (single or bifocal) that are UNBROKEN and in good enough condition to be used as they are can be donated. Sunglasses, halfglasses or lenses without frames are not needed. Glasses are cleaned, the prescription is read by a computer, and the glasses are catalogued until they are ready to be used. After a patient is examined and glasses are prescribed, an effort is made to match up their prescription with one of the ones on hand. With a large collection and with new ones added monthly, a large percentage of the patients are supplied with eyeglasses. They may not get their choice of frames, but they do see much better.

SOME TESTS FOR RIGHT AND WRONG

"Wherefore, if meat make my

brother to offend, I will eat no flesh while the world standeth, lest I make my brother to offend" (I Cor. 8:13)

In the text Paul gives voice to a principle that is relevant for much that concerns us in the modern day even though few of us will be bothered concerning the eating of meat that has been offered on a pagan altar. Paul was referring to a local problem of great significance to new disciples in Corinth. They were recent converts from paganism, and it had been their custom to offer meat sacrifices on the altar of their pagan gods. They looked upon this eating of meat as being an expression of worship. The more mature Christians recognized that these pagan idols were actually "nothings". They did not believe that the eating of this meat was harmful or sinful as far as they personally were concerned.

Paul urged upon them that love and concern for the weaker brother should be the guiding principe that controlled their behavior. He declared that he would abstain from eating meat rather than be the cause of weaker brother falling into sin because of his doing so. He gave voice to a principle rather than to a rigid law.

The principle is applicable as we face the continuing necessity of making moral decisions concerning proper conduct in our day. He who looks for a special prohibition against every form of evildoing will find himself in great difficulty. We must seek to discover principles and then with the help of the Holy Spirit apply them to the complexities of the modern world. I will list several tests that we can use to help us make decisions concerning right and wrong. It would be beneficial for all of us to observe these tests, and it would be most helpful to young people to memorize them.

1. THE SPIRITUAL TEST

Is this action or attitude expressly forbidden in the Word of God? Am I aware of what the Bible teaches concerning this issue? Am I willing to let the teaching of the Bible be authoritative and determine my conduct?

2. THE PRAYER TEST

Is this something concerning that which I can ask for both the approval and the blessings of God? Can I count on God to smile upon it and to bless it?

3. THE PERSONAL TEST

Will doing this particular thing make of me a better Christian? Will it aid my spiritual growth? Will it cause me to become more Christ-like?

4. THE SOCIAL TEST

Will my doing this particular thing influence othres to be better Christians or will it provide a stumbling block before their feet?

5. THE PRACTICAL TEST

What will the results be if I do this particular thing? Will they be desirable or undesirable? Will they produce happiness or unhappiness for me or for others?

6. THE STEWARDSHIP TEST

Will I be fulfilling God's purpose for my life, or will I be wasting that which God has entrusted in my care?

7. THE UNIVERSAL TEST

What would happen if everyone did this? Would the community be better or worse?

8. THE PUBLICITY TEST

Is this something that I would be willing for everyone to know about? Will it stand the gaze of the public without causing me to blush?

9. THE MISSIONAREY TEST

Will it help or hinder the progress of the Kingdom of God around the world?

10. THE EVANGELISTIC TEST

Will this cause others to want to know my Savior? Or will it cause them to lose confidence in him whom I claim as my Savior?

As we each face the question "Is it right or wrong?" we will find that the Holy Spirit can guide us in moments when decisions need to be made if we will apply these tests to the issues under consideration.





GOD'S GENEROSITY REVEALED IN GIVING US CHOICES By Deb Wuethrich

Have you ever written something down only to find it later and wonder, "What in the world did I mean by this?" Better yet, can you even read some of the scratchings you left on a page so you'd remember something later?

I've done both. As an inveterate writer and list maker, my cryptic notes to self are often found on those little colored stickies, at the top of a newspaper and even inside a random page of a one-subject notebook. I get them when they're 17 cents at back to school sales and once had so many, I gave some to my niece. Her mom later brought me some pages with my notes or a few paragraphs of thoughts she'd found inside.

I also keep a pen and notebook by my bedside. Now these can be like hieroglyphics because sometimes I don't turn on the light when a thought pops in my head and I race to get it down.

I just found an undated sheet with two big grease stains on them, undoubtedly from essential oils I rub on aches at night. I can actually read this one, and I noted it was a "conversation with God while abed." It was titled, "Choices." I vaguely recall that night, because the page is full of thoughts that came one after the other during one of those times I just felt God was providing answers to something I'd been pondering or praying about.

I've prayed a lot about, "How do we know God's will?" I remember this particular night, I felt like there was a pretty clear answer that often, He gives us opportunities for choice. It's up to us to discern the direction to take. Amazingly, I've found, God blesses us in our choices, even sometimes when they aren't the clearest or best path. We often have to pick a direction and try it out, knowing He is with us.

Many choices, however, can be easier to discern, often having biblical-based authority behind them. So what follows is what I hurriedly wrote down that night and some current reflection. I hope my list blesses you as it is blessing me again right now.

We get to choose:

Loss—or Gain. Not that we can choose losing loved ones or anything like that. But we can choose to learn from our losses, or gain wisdom through the experience. We can weep, and I know God is with us in this. But we also have the chance to allow Him to strengthen us in our sorrow.

Apathy—or Love. We can become so complacent, but there are so many opportunities to love other

people. And didn't Jesus remind us to love God—and one another?

Mark time—or forward movement. Related to complacency. We can tell ourselves something is "good enough," and then not take any other steps. Or we can step out, even take risks, and make progress on goals, in relationships and in spiritual growth. Also related in my notes: Sit and Wait—Choose to Move.

Shrivel up—or Truly Live. This one reminded me of times I've wanted to curl up in a fetal position and shut out the world but did something anyway, only to realize God wants us to take chances and get out there and be with other people and have new experiences.

Ignore—or Care. Pass up opportunities to better a circumstance—or Help. There are people in need everywhere we look. Let's choose to do something, even if it is a small act of kindness or word of encouragement.

Problems—or Opportunities. I think everyone may have heard by now of a character in the Chinese language that represents both. Sometimes what we see as one is really a chance to experience the other.

Closed minded—or open minded. With what's going today, wherever we turn, we are, sadly, seeing backsliding in prejudice, tolerance and attempts at living in unity. But we can choose the open-minded approach and try to understand where others are coming from. In my devotional time the other day, I was led to Leviticus 19:33-34—"When an alien lives with you in your land, do not mistreat him. The alien living with you must be treated as one of your nativeborn. Love him as yourself, for you were aliens in Egypt. I am the Lord your God." Good reminder for the present.

These choices I encounter often: Judgment—or Mercy. Fear—or Trust. All we need do is think of Jesus and what He did to make these choices.

Finally, Stagnate—or Create. Sometimes I get too comfortable watching TV, taking naps or doodling in my adult coloring book. These are leisure pursuits and they can feel good. But I know I was made for more. To get busy and write takes a little effort, but after completing a piece, I know part of God's purpose for my life is to encourage others. It also helps when He whispers in my ear at night and I obey by writing down a few notes to share later!
