

One of Christian music's most popular and respected artists will be bringing his unique style to Olean First Baptist on Friday, May 6. The event is sponsored by the Olean FBC Women's Ministry in cooperation with Family Life Ministries.

Fernando was scheduled to come to Olean in 2020, shortly after our successful and inspiring Nichole Nordeman concert, but pandemic lockdowns prevented going ahead with the event.

With three Gospel Music Association Dove Awards and a Billboard Latin Music Award to his credit, Fernando's Christian radio hits include, "This Good Day," "Jesus, King of Angels" and "Sleepless Night."

He is renowned for his stirring arrangements of beloved hymns such as "Give Me Jesus" and "Be Thou My Vision," among others. His solo discography features 18 projects in a heralded career spanning more than 25 years.

"Every aspect of our lives should be measured out by the narrative of Christ's life," Fernando says.

During the pandemic, Fernando released a Christmas EP in 2020 and more recently explored a different side of his creativity releasing a book titled, "Fernando's Birds—Photographs and Tales." The book is already sold out but he is in the process of reordering.

Pre-sale prices for tickets are: Artist Circle \$35; General Admission \$30; Seniors (65+) and Students \$25. If tickets are still available the night of the concert, all prices will increase \$5 at the door. If you purchased tickets to the previous 2020 event and did not claim a refund, your ticket will be honored at this event.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

- 3. Possess the motivation to pursue post-secondary education/training
- 4. Demonstrate financial need
- 5. Submit all available transcripts or copies of grades and/or evidence of growth during recent years of education/training
- 6. Complete entire application and write accompanying essay





THE PASTOR'S PAGE

I leave my peace with you. I give my peace to you. I do not give it to you as the world does. Do not let your hearts be troubled. And do not be afraid. John 14:27

I heard the story of a man who was looking for a job. After applying everywhere else in town, he had the idea of applying at the local zoo, hoping to get a job feeding the animals. The manager at the zoo said they had no openings, but seeing how big this guy was, he offered him another position. "Our gorilla died the other day, and he was one of our most popular exhibits. If we got you a special gorilla suit, would you put it on and imitate him for a few days, until the new gorilla arrives? We'll pay you well for it."

The man was so desperate for work he agreed. In fact, after a few hours, he really got into the part—beating his chest and shaking the bars. Huge crowds were gathering. Maybe this won't be so bad after all, he told himself.

But one day, he was swinging on a trapeze and lost his grip. His momentum carried him right over a tall chain-link fence into the middle of the lion's den. Looking up at this intruder in his domain, the huge lion gave a ferocious roar. The crowds were mesmerized.

What was the man to do? If he cried out for help, it would reveal his true identity. He slowly walked backward away from the lion, hoping to climb the fence back into his own cage. The lion, however, with a hungry look on his face, began to stalk him step by step. Finally, in desperation, the gorilla hollered, "Help!"

Immediately the lion answered in an annoyed whisper, "Shut up or you'll get us both fired!"

We all face our fears and anxieties differently. Some try to live as if they don't exist while others bottle them up. Sometimes we face our fears like this man in the gorilla suit. We act brave because the people we love the most need to see our strength. We can keep this up for quite a while, but over time the pressures and stresses wear us down until we realize there is nothing between us and a lion but a silly costume of bravado.

One of the most repeated phrases in the Bible is, "Do not be afraid." Some estimates put it at about 365 times that someone is told not to fear. Angels often say this to people receiving messages from God. God himself says this to his prophets and then those prophets are instructed to tell His people not to be afraid. When the Israelites stand on the brink of battle, they are told not to fear because God is with them.

There are things in this world that should cause us fear, but the gift of God through Christ is peace. We can face the uncertainties of this world knowing nothing is going to surprise God. We can face messages of illness or loss knowing God will not leave us, nor forsake us. We can even face persecution knowing God is on our side. The book of Revelation shows God's victory is planned. So, the next time you are facing a lion, whether literal or figurative, remember who shut the mouths of lions before and be at peace.

They find racism and bigotry in the oddest places. We are taught to shun those who don't think like us. And then there is the war in Ukraine! If you have ever doubted that evil exists in the world, you need look no further than the atrocities being committed by the Russian military... indiscriminately bombing hospitals, nursing homes, schools, and other civilian targets! reports... the video feeds... the photographs are heart-wrenching and sickening! As Christians, we are repulsed by what we see. We want to strike back but feel powerless to do so! That's the double-edge sword of free will. We can choose to do good, or we can choose to be evil... and God will allow it... to a point. But a day of reckoning is coming! And when did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.'

"Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry, and you gave me no food, I was thirsty, and you gave me no drink, I was a stranger, and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, saying, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to you?' Then he will answer them, saying, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life." Matthew 25: 31-46

So, getting back to an earlier thought... are we truly powerless to do anything about evil in our time? No, we are **not**! We can **pray**! We can ask the Creator of all things to intervene in any situation. We can pray for our leaders, that they might see the error of their ways and turn to God for guidance. Beyond The Trappings of Easter Finery

My Easter memories always include my mother. Mom sewed matching dresses and little fabric purses for me and my sister Cheri. We wore these in the Easter photos, grinning over filled Easter baskets. I was a First Baptist kid then, attending with my Grandmother, Amy Brown, and not just at Easter

Later when Mom remarried and had our brothers Scott and Dale, she still liked to deck us all out, only we made special trips to local shops for new finery, including hats (Easter bonnets). Mom liked to include a new outfit for herself and usually posed in the photo as well. (Our step-dad wanted no part of this annual activity.) I have to laugh whenever I come across one snapshot with the two little brothers in dapper suits, black hats, making faces and flapping their hands.

While the clothes extravaganza was an Easter event, it was only on the fringes of church attendance. I didn't know then, but we were among the group regular attenders called the "Christmas and Easter" bunch. Some years, mom took us to "our old church" at First Baptist and sometimes a Methodist church that used to sit in the vicinity of the Olean Fire Station until it burned, the church of *her* youth. In my mind, both were cavernous, impressive places and I liked going.

For a period, we were sent to church with neighbors and friends, to a tiny country church in Port Allegany where I remember cutting out Styrofoam crosses to decorate one Easter, and later to the St. Andrews Methodist Church in Westons Mills. As an adult, I accompanied family to FBC on visits home as "one of those Christmas Eve people," but Easter was typically at home with our daughter, Michele.

Gordy and I finally returned to church full time in the early 2000s. It was a time of recommitment in many ways—to each other, and to God. I enjoyed St. Peter's Episcopal Church because the *Book of Common Prayer* held many clues to what Easter was really about, from its rites for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter morning. I've found similar comfort in my circle-back to FBC. Sometimes I remember Mom, the new clothes and her determination to let us experience church at least on Easter. I've also been blessed to experience a much deeper faith than I knew then, thanks to the love of the Resurrected Savior!
