CONTINUING EDUCATION

Our church offers financial scholarship to assist with expenses for church members

planning to continue their education. An application for consideration is available in the lobby information tower and should be submitted by **April 26, 2024.** It will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee that is appointed by the Board of Trustees who administers this fund. This committee will consider factors such as dedication to Christian principals, evidence of Christian service, participation in FBC programs, educational achievement, extra-curricular activities and financial need. Letters of congratulation will be mailed to recipients, who will be recognized in worship on a Sunday in June. Eligibility requirements:

1. Be an active participant at Olean First Baptist church for at least 3 years, a church member for 2 years

2. Be at least a high school graduate/scheduled to graduate by August

3. Possess the motivation to pursue post-secondary education/training

4. Demonstrate financial need

5. Submit all available transcripts or copies of grades and/or evidence of growth during recent years of education/training

6. Complete entire application and write accompanying essay


- EASTER SUNDAY: Do You Really 'Get' Easter?

THE MODERATOR'S MUSINGS

One of the more interesting discussions (or arguments?) I participated in during a theology class at St. Bonaventure

University was related to the following question: What is the most important Christian holiday? Many chose Easter because it was the day Jesus rose from the dead... conquering death and providing us a path to eternal life. Others argued that Christmas was most important because it was the day that God became man... and Jesus had to be born before He could die and rise. It seemed like it would be a battle between those two days until someone suggested that Good Friday should be #1 because it is the day Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice. He noted that there could be no resurrection without the death. The sacrificial lamb had to die for our sins. I remember many being annoyed, even angry, that someone would suggest Good Friday was more important than Christmas or Easter. I understood their negative reaction. After all, Christmas and Easter are "feel good" days... our Savior was born... our Savior was risen... giving us reasons to celebrate. Conversely, Good Friday is typically considered a "downer day" of sacrifice, suffering, sadness, and death. Why would anyone put it first? After much discussion, the group finally concluded that all three are equally important. Jesus became a man (Christmas)... Jesus died (Good Friday) ... and Jesus rose from the dead (Easter). The story is not complete without all three. However, there is something special about Good Friday. It is a uniquely Christian "holiday." While Christmas and Easter are celebrated by Christians and non-Christians, only Christians recognize the importance of Good Friday. There is no counter-Christian or secular celebration on Good Friday. If anything, the secular world tries to force us to ignore it. I remember when Good Friday was recognized as a holiday... a day off from work... but few companies or organizations include it on their holiday schedules these days. Regardless, as Christians, we should pause on Good Friday and truly consider what Jesus went through for us! The mock trials... the abuse... the humiliation... the brutal scourging that ripped His flesh from His body... being abandoned by those closest to Him... being forced to carry His cross to Golgotha... the searing pain of the nails piercing His hands and feet... the agony as His body hung on the Cross... gasping for breath... the taunting... the hate... and finally death. There are no words to

adequately describe what He suffered... because of His love for us!

I also often wonder what it must have been like for His disciples and followers. They had so much hope... so many expectations, only to watch their teacher, their rabbi, the Messiah die on a cross and be buried in a tomb. It wasn't supposed to happen like this... or so they thought. They must have been emotionally and spiritually crushed! The emotional high of the triumphant entry into Jerusalem just days earlier... gone!! Their dreams... shattered. I imagine it was a sleepless night followed by a Sabbath day in hiding... confused... dejected... defeated... demoralized. As night fell, they likely slept, succumbing to emotional and physical exhaustion. *Then came the morning...*

As I have mentioned many times, I draw spiritual inspiration through music. It was not by chance that I ended the preceding paragraph with the phrase in bold italics. That is the name of a popular Gospel song. Many have performed "Then Came The Morning..." but my favorite is by Ernie Haase & amp; Signature Sound... and, in particular, the version that is available on YouTube from 2016 (https://youtu.be/cJc-HrfLqtM). While I probably shouldn't admit it, despite having watched that video countless times, it still brings tears to my eyes. It is an incredibly powerful song that takes the listener from the lows of Good Friday to the exhilaration of Easter morning! Though you might not like that style of music, I strongly recommend you take time to listen to the song... at least once. And please listen closely to the lyrics.

By the way, if you do like what you hear, as noted elsewhere in this newsletter, Ernie Haase & amp; Signature Sound will be performing at Family Life Network on Friday, April 19th and Saturday, April 20th . It is not the same group of singers as two of the four shown in the video have been replaced, but they still put on an inspiring show.

In closing, please join me in praying for our church, our church's leaders, and our new pulpit committee as we embark on our search for our next senior pastor. And please pray for our new interim, Pastor Ivan, as he leads us until our new pastor arrives. We are blessed to have such an experienced pastor filling the void during the search process.

Writing Book Eased Burden of Grief By Deb Wuethrich

Those who know me or read my column in the *Times Herald* have heard me talk for years about the fact that I wanted to publish at least a couple of books that I've been working on. It has been like a bucket list or a dreamed of

event. I have several almost-finished manuscripts, but I've been tinkering a long time on two that I felt were very important to get in print before I leave this earth. The Lord has been blessing me greatly lately. First, He brought forth the bathroom remodel that I seriously needed, and He did it earlier than had been contracted. It's beautiful! I now have a real, working shower again that doesn't drip down onto the kitchen stove!

Next, He put an opportunity in front of me that gave me a publishing option that I had been seeking for years. A multi-published author and speaker colleague, James Watkins, just began a new publishing venture designed to help Christian authors who just want to get their words out there before family and friends. He's doing this because he loves to help other writers and because he's appalled at how costly it can be to self-publish or impossible to get a bite from the big royalty publishers.

He's my hero! *Dance While the Music Still Plays*— *Hope & Help for When Your Child is Incurable* is now available on Amazon.com. I'm being careful not to be a "moneychanger in church," but many loyal friends in the congregation have asked how to access this book that's so close to my heart.

It was not an easy book to write, and may not be an easy book to read for some. But I'd like you to consider something. As Christians, we have hope, even when the worst does happen. This is a story of my courageous daughter, our family's journey with spinal muscular atrophy, which has no cure. It's also a story of God's faithfulness throughout our journey.

While I have been working on this book for nearly three decades, I would not have had the Christian maturity to finish it until now. God has been working in my heart each time I've made attempts to smooth out the book's rough edges. Over time, it was God who showed me the themes, the images of how He sings over us while He weaves on the loom of life, encouraging us to "Dance While the Music Plays."

Now that it is done and finally out there, I realize that part of a heavy burden of grief has been lifted.

This process, which included spending hours with God's Holy Spirit in the writing and thought making up the journey, has also been healing. Others have already told me that it has helped them view their own losses—and life-giving opportunities, even in difficult circumstances—in a little different light. This encourages me greatly because that's what I wanted. I wanted to share Michele's story, and in large part, Gordy's and mine, too, but I wanted to focus on what Jesus did for us. He taught us to live each day fully and as joyfully as we could and to see, even now, how one's lifesong lives on, impacting others. He revealed how His songs never end. They're just repurposed for holy use in eternity, where we'll meet again.

There will be a Book Launch Event at Portville Free Library on Thursday, April 4, 2024, at 6:30 p.m. If you don't use Amazon and would like to inquire about a copy, just put a note in my church mailbox or call me. And thank you to so many of my church friends for the interest and support they have already shown. I was "an author" before with work in 11 anthologies and more columns and newspaper articles than I can count. But this one is special. God is so good!
